ADVICE & PRECAUTIONS

PERIODS OF ACCESSIBILITY

The routes presented in this document can be undertaken in summer conditions, that is to say in the absence of snow or ice. Some routes located at high altitude or on shady slopes may retain late snowfalls (until late spring, or even late summer for some routes). Before planning an itinerary, always check with the Tourist Information Points as to whether the walking routes are operational.

WEATHER AND EQUIPMENT

Bad weather conditions (fog, rain, wind, cold storm, etc) can also turn an easy course into a real ordeal. It is essential to check the weather forecast before departure and to adapt your outings to the daily conditions. Essential equipment: suitable shoes, warm clothes, windbreaker, headwear, sunglasses, sunscreen, water,

RESPECT FOR OUTDOOR AREAS AND THEIR USERS

- Keep your dog on a lead.
- Stay away from herds.
- Park in dedicated spaces.
- Leave nothing behind (picnic leftovers; toilet paper; stone balancing, etc).




- Dogs must be on a lead.
- Gathering and collecting (minerals, animals) is prohibited.
- Noise and disturbances are prohibited.
- Fires are prohibited.
- Bivouacs are allowed at regulated times and dates.

Take a pleasant stroll through the streets of the village of Argelès-Gazost. From ancient stones to the scent of roses, Argelès-Gazost awaits you... Walk through the streets, squares, fountains, parks and natural spaces and discover a thousand and one natural wonders mixed with ancient heritage.

STARTING POINT : ARGELÈS-GAZOST. Place de l'Église.

ROUTE MARKERS: SMALL YELLOW SIGNS. Signs with red flowers and the title "Balade fleurie".



This is a short family walk through the Gave d'Azun gorges. In summer, you will enjoy the shade afforded by the tall trees and the cool waters of the stream. On the way, you will discover flora and fauna typical to the shady and humid areas along the valley floor. The more seasoned hiker can carry on past the wooden footbridge and follow the loop up towards the village of Arcizans-Avant and the chapel of Saint-Castère. Then count on 2 hours and 200 m of ascent. Medium difficulty.

STARTING POINT: ARGELÈS-GAZOST. Rue de l'Arrieulat.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS & YELLOW MARKERS. Follow signs for "Arrieulat".



From the Vieuzac district, the path will lead you to the Balandrau stones viewing point: a place filled with legends and an unusual panorama over the valley. The route is very pleasant and skirts the edge of the forest, bordered by pretty stone walls. It alternates between gentle slopes and flats. You will pass alongside the perimeters of the "Parc Animalier des Pyrénées", and with a little luck will see some of its guests... Further on, in the forest, the chestnut tree is king and the old trees with their enigmatic shapes are everywhere in this once exploited chestnut grove.

STARTING POINT: ARGELÈS-GAZOST, Vieuzac Car Park.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS & YELLOW MARKERS.

This pass dominates the discreet Bergons valley. The trail climbs gradually in a landscape alternating between meadows and fern moorland. Beautiful views over the valley come thick and fast. Once you arrive at the mountain pastures, you are not far from the pass, nestled between the rock faces of Soum de Leiz and Soum d'Andorre. At the pass, the view to the south stretches for miles. To the north, you can see the beautiful forests of the Pibeste-Aoulhet Regional Nature Reserve.

STARTING POINT: BERGONS Car Park.

From the village of Salles, follow the "Route du Bergons" road; at the end of it, follow the track for 1 km and park in the Car Park signposted "départ".

ROUTE MARKERS: Yellow signs. Follow signs for "Col d'Andorre".



This Agos-Vidalos discovery trail is a lovely walking loop at the foot of the Pibeste massif, amongst vegetation with Mediterranean scents. On this dry and arid slope, the path climbs steeply through a beautiful oak grove dotted with boxwood hedges. When you arrive at the "crêtes de la serre" ridges, you will come face to face with the spectacular "Trou" cliffs, the realm of many birds of prey. The path is dotted with numerous information boards about the Pibeste-Aoulhet Nature Reserve and its rich fauna.

STARTING POINT: AGOS-VIDALOS. Maison de la Réserve Naturelle Car Park. The path starts at "Rue des Vignes" above the Car Park.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS. Follow signs for "Sentier de découverte"



The Pic du Pibeste (1 348 m) is one of the first peaks you see as you enter the valley from the plains. Its location, at the gateway to the Pyrenees range, makes it an extraordinary viewing point. The climb starts at the beautiful village of Ouzous, on the sunny side of the mountain. The slope is merciless. The landscapes change one after another. At the beginning it is Mediterranean. but changes radically when you reach the "col des Portes", where you unexpectedly come upon the Ayzi plateau, with its green summer pastures. The trail starts its final ascent through a beautiful and mysterious beech forest before reaching the Pic du Pibeste and its old funicular arrival station.

STARTING POINT: OUZOUS VILLAGE Car Park, at the exit of the village towards Salles.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS & YELLOW MARKERS. Follow signs for "Pic du Pibeste" and yellow paint markers.



The route begins in the heart of the pretty village of Saint-Savin known for its 12th century abbey and its houses with their traditional Bigourdan architecture. You will start at the Piétat chapel, located on a rocky outcrop with a magnificent panorama across the valley. The trail then climbs steeply through the undergrowth, until it reaches the beautiful little village of Uz and its chapel, clinging to the mountainside. As you continue, the vegetation changes with the gain in altitude: the path now passes under hazelnut trees then between heathers and ferns. Finally, the small Pouyaspé chapel reveals itself, perched at an altitude of 956 m and hikers can enjoy a spectacular view of the narrow, steep valleys facing it.

STARTING POINT: SAINT-SAVIN. Central Village Square.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS. Follow signs for "Chapelle de Piétat" then "Chapelle de Pouyaspé".



Discover the forests that line the slopes of Cabaliros. These hillside forests, filled with old trees, have an enigmatic ambiance and are a real refuge for wildlife. At the highest point of the walk, an impressive panorama awaits you: a view over the gorges of the Gave de Cauterets river. The route then plunges back into the valley along the sunny side. You can then return to the village, thanks to the "Voie Verte", that follows the original old railway line!

STARTING POINT: PIERREFITTE-NESTALAS. Take the "Voie Verte" path towards Cauterets.

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS.


Follow the "Voie Verte" towards Cauterets for 700 m. Then leave the "Voie Verte" and follow signs towards "Chapelle de Pouyaspé / Coutres". After a series of switchbacks, at an intersection, take the flat path to the left until you reach the belvedere. Then head back down into the valley until you reach the "Voie Verte" and follow it back to Pierrefitte.



An easy and bucolic walk between streams and hay meadows... The route begins at the pleasant site of Saillet, following the Gabarret stream. It joins the "Voie Verte des Gaves" for a short part (watch out for cyclists), before leading onto pleasant paths beside the hay meadows. The path finally joins the banks of the Gave de Pau to bring you back to the starting point via the former "Lac des Gaves", now filled due to successive floods.

STARTING POINT: LAU-BALAGNAS - SAILLET Car Park (next to the Lau'Folies swimming pool).

ROUTE MARKERS: Follow the signposts "parcours VTT n°6" (mountain bike route no. 6 - orange triangle with 2 circles).



Discover the old pastoral paths which linked the villages and the barn districts. Leaving Beaucens, the forest path climbs steeply alongside barns and meadows. After passing the ruins of Bédouret chapel you reach the village of Artalens. You then return via a pleasant path which takes you to the "Croix d'Arry" cross, then via the cattle track which joins the path you took on the way out. At the "Croix d'Arry", you can head up to the "Cap du Mourquey" viewing point (allow 40 minutes and an additional 120 m of elevation).

STARTING POINT: BEAUCENS. Picnic area, "Rue du château".

ROUTE MARKERS: YELLOW SIGNS AND YELLOW MARKERS. Follow signs for "Chapelle du Bédouret"; then after the chapel ruins, signs for "Artalens"; at Artalens, follow signs for "Croix d'Arry". Once you are there, go down the track and follow the path to Beaucens.



This is a nice route along the grassy and rounded ridges of the Hautacam. There is a pleasant path that runs along this ridge, in the middle of the many herds of cows, sheep or horses that enjoy the summer pastures. The panorama is fabulous, and you are afforded views of many peaks and valleys.

STARTING POINT: HAUTACAM. Car Park at the "Refuge de Tramassel" restaurant.

ROUTE MARKERS: NOT MARKED. Follow the wide path that starts behind the Tramassel restaurant and stay on the upper part of the ridge until you reach a cattle park. Return via the track to the starting point.



This pretty mountain lake is easy to get to. Odd as it may seem, the outward journey is downhill, and the return journey is uphill. The route winds gently down the sunny side of the mountain, through heather and blueberry moors. In the background, the summer pastures, and summits of the Léviste massif. The shores of the lake are perfect for whiling away the hours.

STARTING POINT: HAUTACAM. Tramassel Car Park. Parking available higher up at the Moulata pass; at the end of the track (allow for 1 hour and 70 m less vertical drop).

ROUTE MARKERS: NOT MARKED. From Tramassel, follow the wide track which climbs between the two ski lifts.



From the Moulata pass, the trail follows the mountainside for a long time, across the open moors. The route overlooks the valley and Lake Isaby, against a backdrop of the stunning peaks of the Léviste massif. We quickly reach the Hourquette d'Houscouaou, a wide mountain pass from where it is easy to get to the pretty Ourrec lake, which is shaped like a heart! Its turquoise colour, the shepherd's hut and the many herds grazing on this pretty grassy plateau make for a most bucolic picture.

STARTING POINT: HAUTACAM. Tramassel Car Park. Parking available higher up at the Moulata pass; at the end of the track (allow for 1 hour and 70 m less vertical drop).

ROUTE MARKERS: UNMARKED.



The "Voie Verte des Gaves" follows the route of the old railway line which linked Lourdes to Soulom and had been disused **since 1992.** Transformed in 2000, this is now a dedicated route for walkers, cyclists and rollerbladers. It is also accessible to people with reduced mobility and strollers. 18 km in length, it is perfect for both a quiet family walk, as well as a long walk from village to village through the open and green landscapes of the valley. From Pierrefitte-Nestalas you are able to continue on the "Voie Verte" to Cauterets (unpaved track on this section).

STARTING POINT: ENTRY POINTS. Access to the "Voie Verte" in many villages. Main entry points, with car parking availability: Boô-Silhen, Argelès-Gazost, Pierrefitte-Nestalas.

ROUTE MARKERS: "VOIE VERTE" SIGNPOSTS. White signs with a green bicycle pictogram.



Heritage Walk is a free downloadable mobile app. It offers you **several audio-guided walks.** Each walk has a theme, related to a historical event or to a specific place. Routes in the Argelès-Gazost valley: "In the footsteps of the miners" and "Industrial development in the 20th century" in Pierrefitte-Nestalas; "Arras, village of Artitude" - in Arras en Lavedan; "Hautacam under the stars" in Hautacam.
